

# Fresh Bucks 2023 Impact

Fresh Bucks is a SNAP-matching nutrition incentive program that provides a \$1 for \$1 match on fruit and vegetable purchases at farmers markets, farm stands, and participating grocery stores in Marion County.

Fresh Bucks stretches SNAP dollars so families can purchase and eat more fresh fruits and vegetables, growers gain new customers and additional income, and the local food economy becomes stronger.

\$60,063 in SNAP sales at Fresh Bucks farmers markets, farm stands, and grocery stores.



\$42,114 Fresh
Bucks distributed
at farmers markets, farm stands,
and grocery stores.



Over 2,250 households reached.



40 Indiana growers benefitted.



## Why Fresh Bucks?

In 2021, 11.3% of Marion County residents were food insecure, or 109,100 people that didn't have reliable or enough access to food<sup>1</sup>. Cost is the most significant barrier low-income households face in buying more fruits and vegetables.

Although SNAP participants eat **fewer fruits and vegetables** than higher income households, participation in SNAP-matching programs, including Fresh Bucks, is associated with **higher fruit and vegetable intake** than the average American adult, as seen above.



### **Families Win**

**93%** of participants surveyed report that Fresh Bucks helps their households afford to eat more balanced meals.

**83%** of participants surveyed report buying more fruits and vegetables because of Fresh Bucks.

**50%** of participants surveyed report being able to better afford rent/mortgage or utilities because of Fresh Bucks.

### **Farmers Prosper**

40 local growers accepted Fresh Bucks through farmers markets, farm stands, and CSA programs.

\$17,844

Fresh Bucks redeemed with local growers.

**\$446** on average of additional income earned by local growers through Fresh Bucks.



#### The **economic impact**

represents the amount of money generated in Indiana from the increased household purchases of fruits and vegetables, and the re-spending of those incentive dollars along the supply chain<sup>4</sup>.

### **How Fresh Bucks Works**

#### **Farmers Markets**

- 1. Go to the market information booth.
- 2. Get SNAP tokens for any amount you choose.
- 3. DOUBLE that on your Fresh Bucks card, up to \$20 per day.
- 4. Shop the market with your tokens and Fresh Bucks card.

#### **Grocery Stores**

- 1. Shop like you normally would.
- 2. DOUBLE up to \$10 on your Fresh Bucks card when you buy fresh fruits and vegetables with your SNAP card.
- 3. Spend your Fresh Bucks on fresh fruits and vegetables next time you shop.
